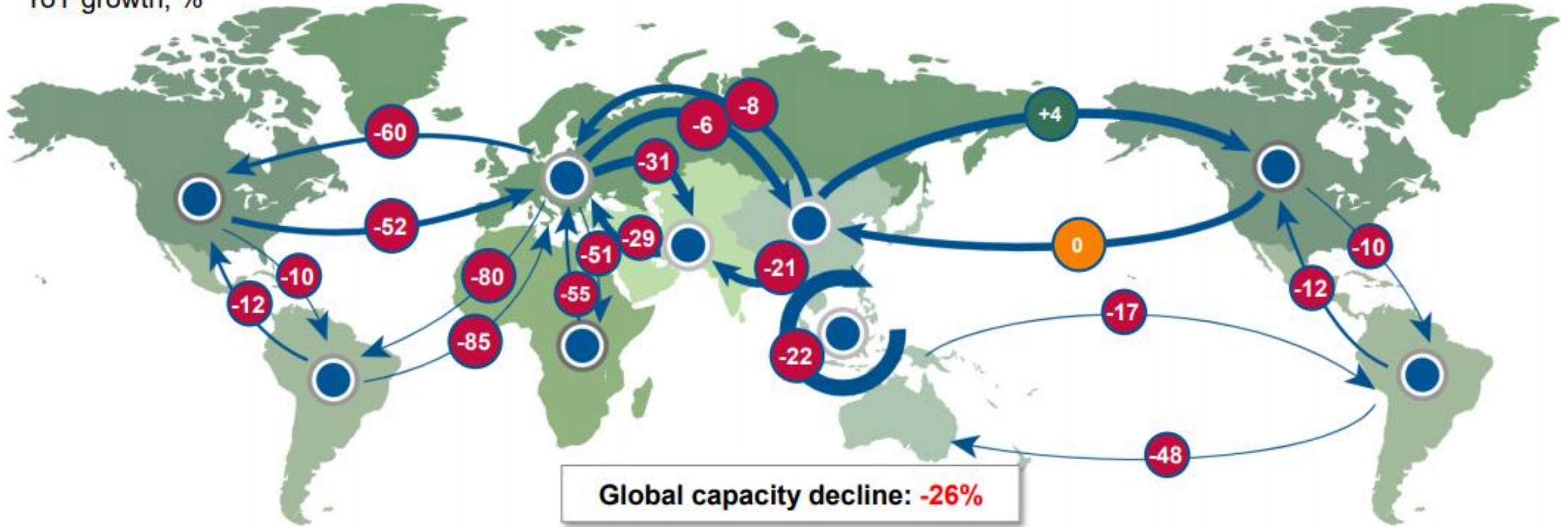

YoY growth, %



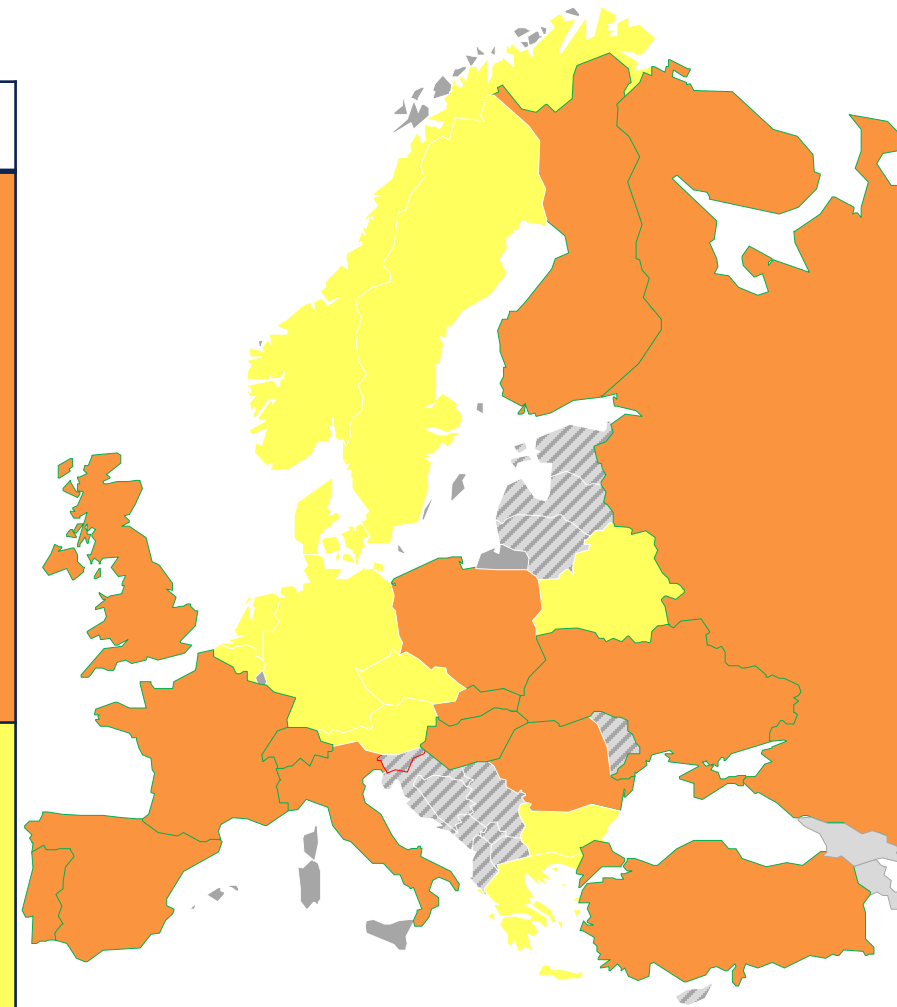
**The Transpacific remains the only trade lane to show air cargo capacity growth**

## Air Freight Updates

- **Scandinavian Airlines:** Resumed service from CPH/Europe to NYC/ORD
- **Suparna Airlines:** Resumed freighter services from AMS/Europe to NKG
- **Air Canada:** Started new cargo-only route from AMS/Europe to YUL
- **Emirates:** Resumed PAX freighters from DXB/Europe to CAI/CMN/EBB/JNB/KRT/NBO/LOS/LLW
- **IEG :** Started new cargo-only route from MAD/Spain to BOG/LIM/MEX/MIA/JFK
- **All Nippon Airways:**
  - Additional freighters added from FRA/Europe to NRT
  - Additional freighters added from LON/UK&IE to HND
  - Additional freighters added from FRA/Europe to HND

## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air Freight:** UPS operations working normal. Adjusting the routing of the freight, in order to have commercial uplift done effectively
- **Ocean Freight:** UPS operations working normal. Ports fully functional. Currently no backlogs

- **Port of Poland, Czech Republic & Portugal** are operational but service constrained
- **Port of UK, Ireland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Turkey, Italy & Spain** are working without any constraints

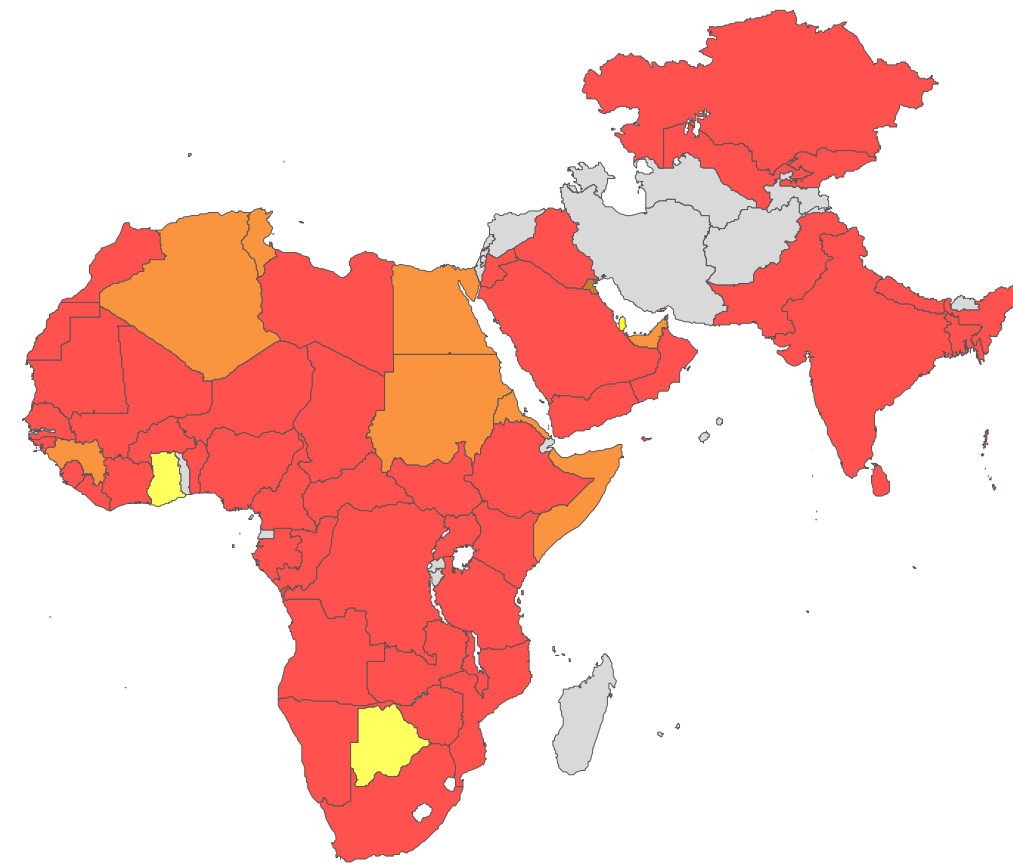


## Inland Transportation

- Border delays are stable and only slightly above pre-COVID times
- Border waiting times on borders of IT→CH, CH→DE, HU→SL & HU→RO — are long

# ISMEA Update for June 4<sup>th</sup>

## Socioeconomic Updates

- **Iraq:** Complete lockdown from June 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>
- **Mozambique:** Lockdown further extended until June 30<sup>th</sup>
- **India:** Cyclone Nisarga hit the Arabian sea on June 3<sup>rd</sup>
  - From June 8<sup>th</sup>, all places of worship, shopping malls, restaurants, hotels and other hospitality services will be allowed to re-open as part of Phase I.



## Air Freight Updates

- **Mozambique :**
  - Freighters are less frequent and unscheduled
  - No passenger flights scheduled
- **Saudi Arabia:**
  - Suspension of all international flights to/from Saudi Arabia is extended until further notice and PAX freighter (cargo flights) only operates from SA



## Ocean Freight Updates

- **Port of Bangladesh** is severely constrained
- **Port of Rwanda, Congo, Tanzania, South Africa, Pakistan, UAE, Egypt & Oman** are operational but service constrained
- **Ports of India, Sri Lanka, Kuwait, Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Zambia, Kenya** are working without any constraints



## Inland transportation

- Final delivery delays of Air / Ocean may happen due to border constraints
- **Iraq:** Local delivery constrained
- **India:** Operations at Mumbai & Cochin impacted due to cyclone Nisarga

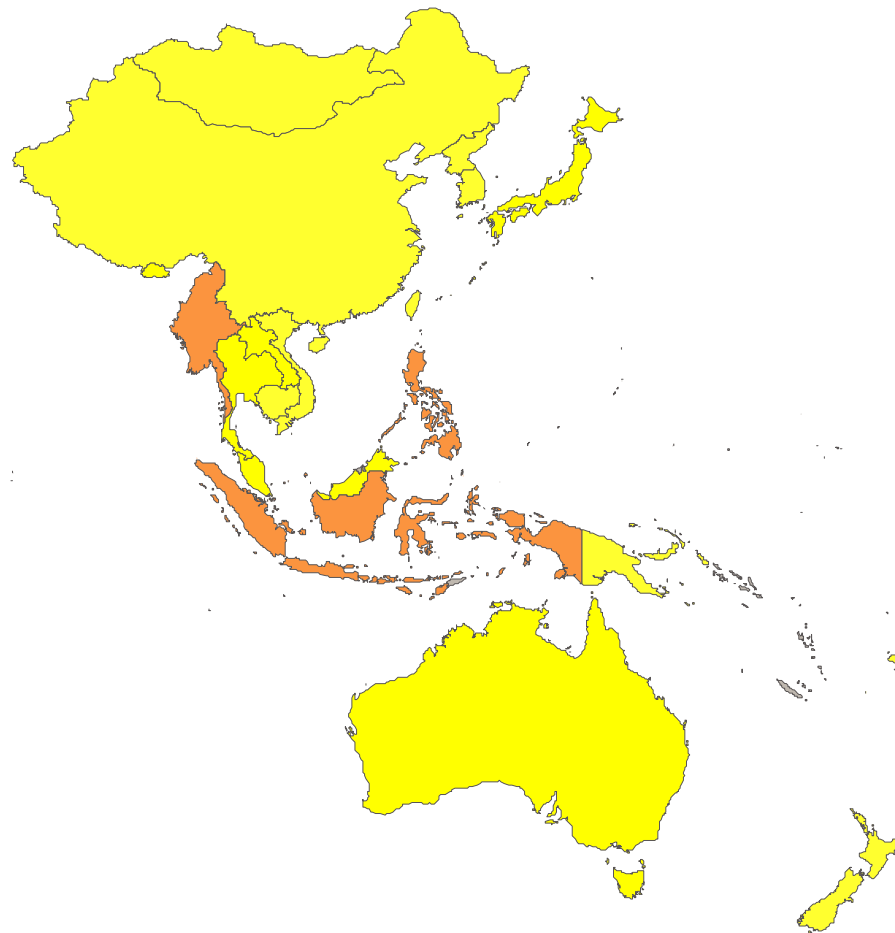
## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air freight :**
  - UPS working but some delays expected due to local condition
- **Ocean Freight:** Running unconstrained
- Local transportation causing delays due to restrictions

# APAC Update for June 4<sup>th</sup>

## Socioeconomic Updates

- **Singapore:** the Multi-Ministry Taskforce has assessed that Singapore will exit the Circuit Breaker when it ends on 1 June 2020. With this, there will be a controlled approach to resume activities safely over three phases:
  - Phase 1: "Safe Re-Opening"
  - Phase 2: "Safe Transition"
  - Phase 3: "Safe Nation"
- **Australia:** Government announced easing of travel restrictions (domestic in June 5, to/from AU/NZ July 1<sup>st</sup> and September 10 other "bubble" countries with low risk)



## Air Freight Updates

- **New Zealand:** strong airfreight services into NZ via a number of airlines (Government collaborative subsidy)
- **Cambodia:** Travelers arriving from France, Germany, Iran, Italy, Spain and the US from 20 May are allowed to entry



## Rail Updates

- **Malaysia:** Road closures, roadblocks and checkpoints have been implemented across the nation. Limited transit between Brunei and Malaysia.

## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air Freight:** Charters available
- **Ocean Freight:** Available capacity
- **Rail/Ground:** Export shipments available, but limited for some countries



## Ocean Freight Updates

- No blank sailing announcement in Asia-Europe WB trade reported today
- Up to June 2, TPEB trade announced 12 blank sailings in June
- Asia-Europe trade announced 8 blank sailings in June
- Carriers have no blank sailing announcement made on the Asia-Europe WB trade since May 29

# United States Update for June 4<sup>th</sup>

## Socioeconomic Updates

- Civil unrest, interstate exit closings prompt warnings of delivery delays.
- New York state reports lowest daily coronavirus death toll yet
- US suspends travel from Brazil for foreigners
- Exports Collapse as Coronavirus affected International trade
- Coronavirus muddies U.S. economic data as business closures push down response rates



## Air Freight Updates

- E-commerce drives multipronged expansion at UPS Airlines
- Air hub is responsible for making Louisville the fourth-largest cargo airport in the world.

## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air Freight:**
  - **JFK:** Recovery times continue to improve after some delays due to staffing
  - Additional charter flights being handled by carriers ground handlers
- **Ocean Freight:** Fully operational
- **Rail/Ground:** Fully operational



## Ocean Freight Updates

- Port of New Orleans railroad upgrades locomotives
- Blank sailings continue with the SSLs.
- World container index – PVG to LA = down / PVG to NY = down / PVG to RTM = stable
- LA/LB; HOU/ MEM ports are severely constrained
- DFW/ ORD/ DTW/ CVG/ MIA ports are somewhat constrained



## Inland transportation

- Truckers on edge as civil unrest rages in major U.S. cities.

# Canada Update for June 4<sup>th</sup>

## Socioeconomic Updates

- Canada might lift travel restrictions by July 1
- Canada Shifts to Maritime for PPE Imports
- Quebec has instituted checkpoints to prevent non-essential travel into the province
- Canada Bans Cruise Ships Through October 1



## Air Freight Updates

Air Canada is resuming many of its international flights, heading to the U.S., the Caribbean, South America, Europe and the Pacific.

The airline will be offering flights to 97 destinations – down from its usual 220 spots.

## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air Freight:** Reduced flights
- **Ocean Freight:** Port restrictions
- **Rail/Ground:** Customs operation impacted



## Ocean Freight Updates

- Ports are operational. Cargo transportation is still allowed
- Slow in/out processing and delays in customs clearance



## Inland transportation

- Daily pickups and deliveries except where restrained by government

# LATAM Update for June 4<sup>th</sup>

## Socioeconomic Updates

- Parts of Latin America reopen as crisis deepens
- Brazil overtakes Spain and Italy as virus cases grow
- US suspends travel from Brazil for foreigners



## Air Freight Updates

**LATAM** Common Carriage flights were reduced or forbidden to/from US, Europe & Asia (19 countries: AR, BO, BR, CL, CO, CR, DO, EC, GT, HN, NI, PA, PE, PR, PY, SR, SV, UY, VE)

## UPS Operations\*\*

- **Air Freight:** Reduced flights
- **Ocean Freight:** Port Restrictions
- **Rail/Ground:** Customs operation impacted



## Ocean Freight Updates

- **Ocean Port Restrictions (3 countries: DO, HN, PR)**  
DO: Operations had been restricted up to 6pm  
HN: Limited service to Puerto Cortez Port  
PR: No passenger vessel allowed



## Inland transportation

- Customs operation impacted (9 Countries: AR, CR, DO, EC, GT, PA, PE, SR, VE)
