

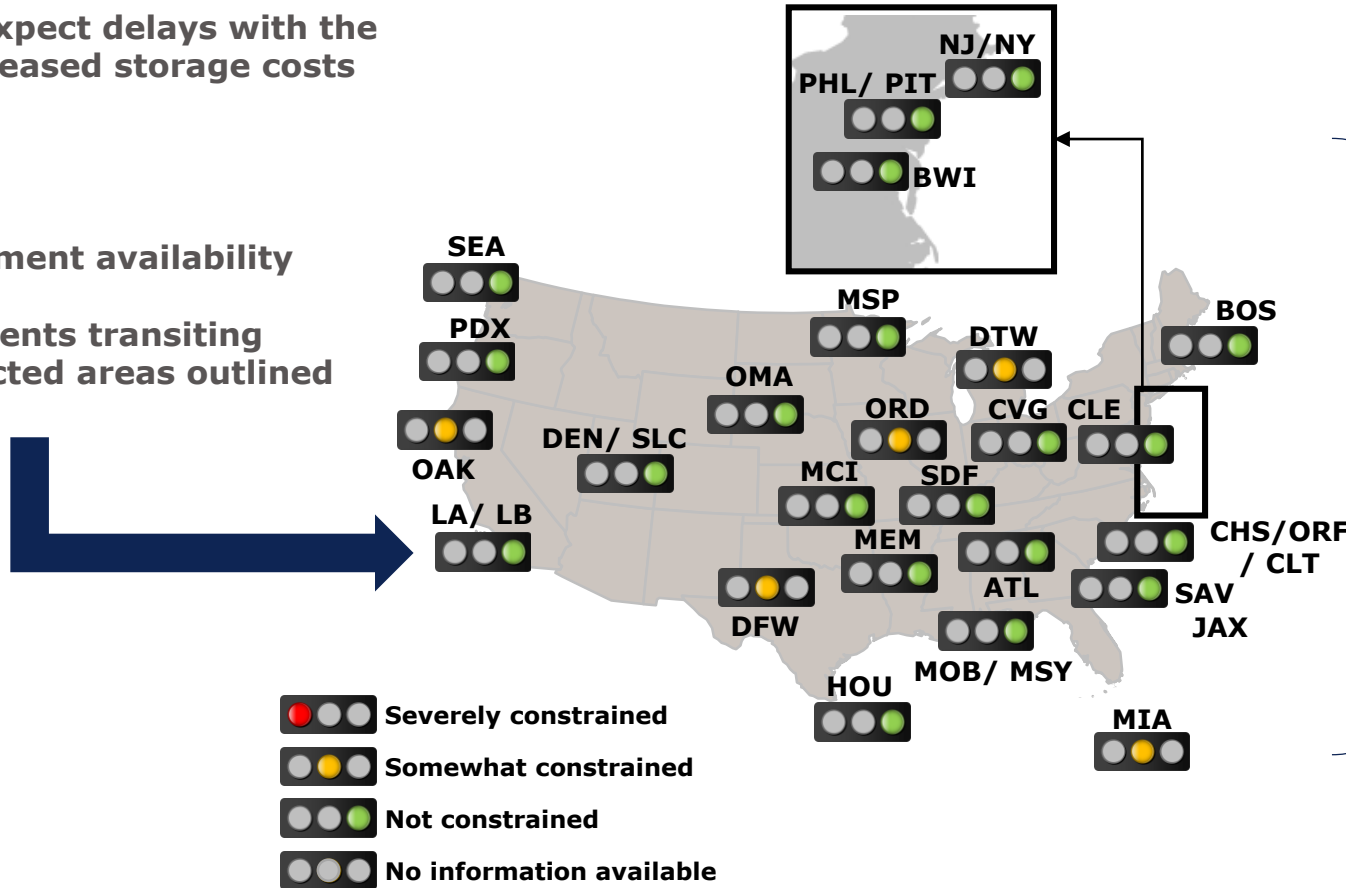


# Week ending June 03, 2020: Slow recovery ahead for intra-Asia volumes amid COVID-19 challenges

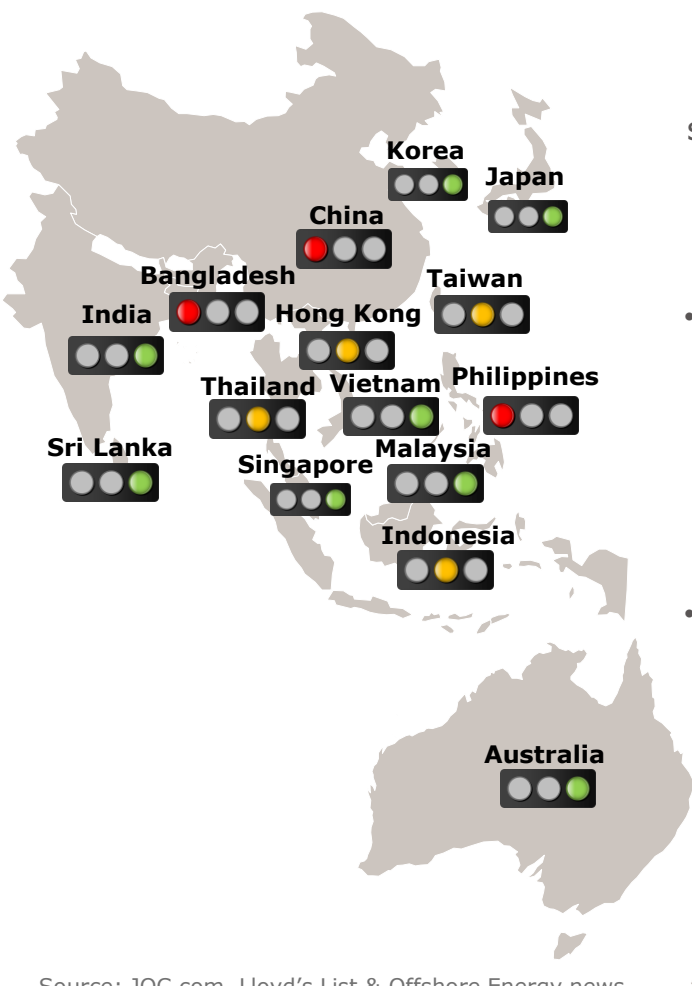

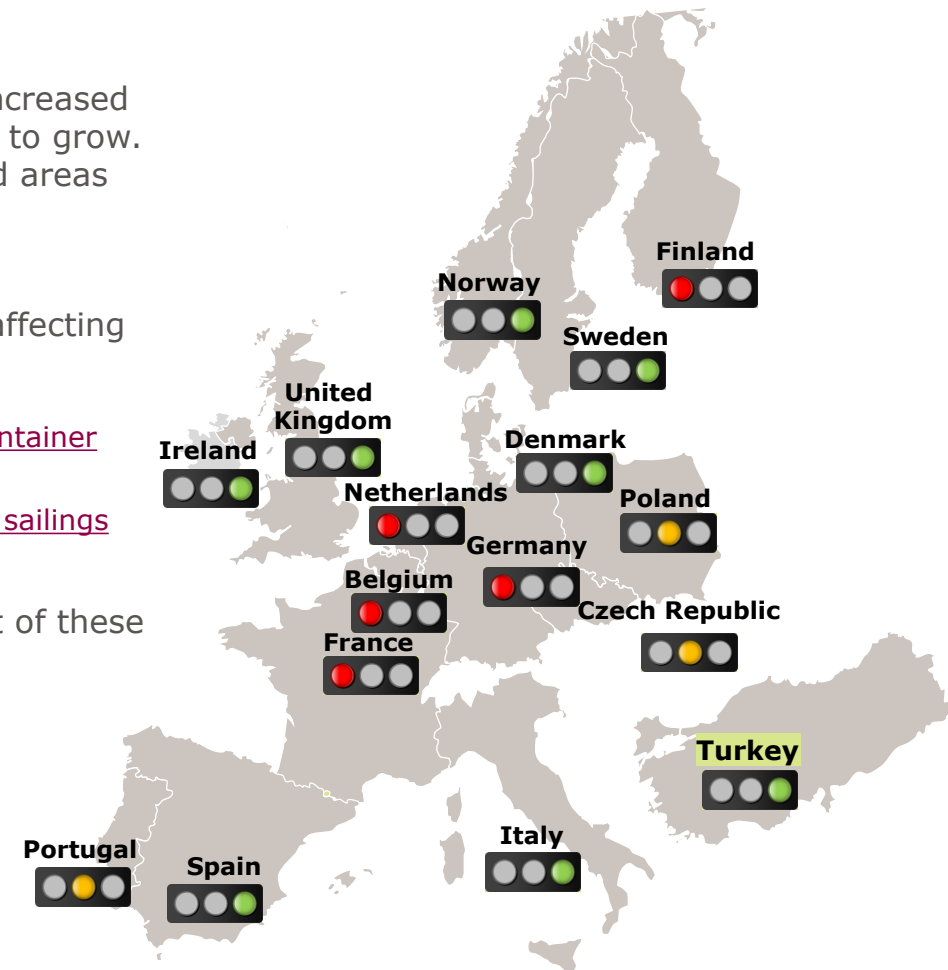


# Week ending June 03, 2020: European ports buffeted by COVID-19 related blank sailings

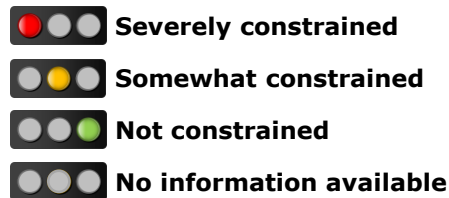

## Central and South American Ports

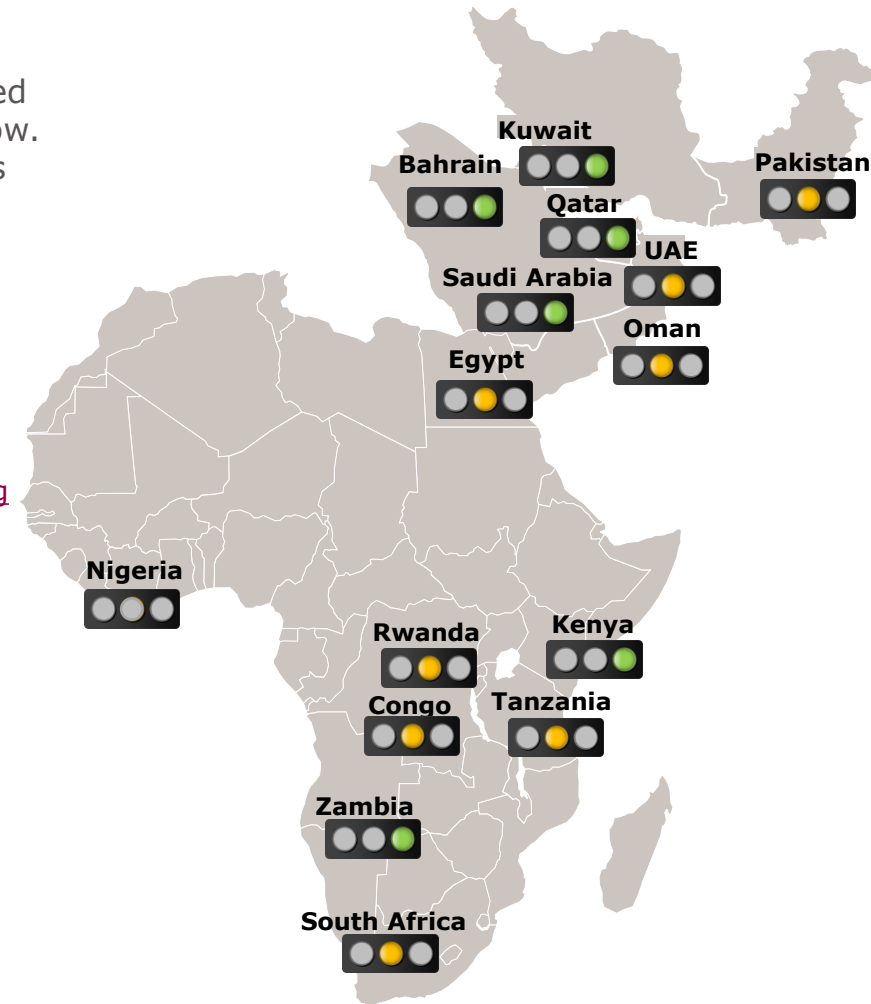
